On October 9, 2000, an ILUA (Indigenous Land Use Agreement) was signed and executed by TSC, the Kaurareg People, and the State of Queensland. This agreement was one of the first ILUAs following the MABO High Court ruling on June 3, 1992, and the Native Title Act of 1993. 
#### **Torres Strait and NPA Regional Organisation of Councils (ROC)**
